# AWARD PRESENTATION - 2PM

## AWARDS

First (Blue), second (red), third (yellow) and honorable mention (white) ribbons will be awarded in all classes as warranted.

### ARTISTIC

**President's Award** - Trophy presented by Presidents of the Avalon Garden Club to a novice for the most outstanding entry in Class 5 or in any other class by a person who has not previously won a blue ribbon in an Avalon Garden Club Flower Show.

**Bonnie F. Feise Excellence in Artistic Design Award** - Trophy presented to the exhibitor receiving the most blue ribbons.

**Petite Award** - Trophy presented to the most outstanding miniature or small entry of Classes 2 and 3.

**Avalon Mayor's Table Award** - Trophy presented to the most outstanding table entry of Classes 6 and 8.

**Lynn Covington Tri-Color Award** - Trophy presented to the most outstanding entry of Classes 1,4,7,9 and 10. Plant Materials need not be of three colors.

**Rachel H. Sloan Best of Show Award** - Trophy presented for the most outstanding Artistic Design entry. All Artistic Blue Ribbon winners are eligible for this award.

### HORTICULTURE

**Marion Poley Award** - Trophy presented to the novice winning the most blue ribbons in Horticulture.

**Best of Show in Horticulture** - Trophy presented to the most outstanding entry in Horticulture.

**Elsie Kuhn Excellence in Horticulture Award** - Trophy presented to Exhibitor receiving the most blue ribbons.

**Catherine McMenamin Award** - Trophy presented to the most outstanding entry in Section L.

**Viewer's Choice in Roses Award** - Trophy presented based on public voting of Section A.

# INFORMATION AND RULES

1. Any amateur is eligible to exhibit.
2. Community Hall will be open for registration and preliminary staging:  
**Friday, June 7, 2019 - 4pm to 6pm**  
**Saturday, June 8, 2019 - 7am to 8:30 am. (Day of Show)**
3. Judging done by National Garden Club Judges and other qualified professional Judges. Their decisions are final.
4. Judging begins promptly at 9am on Saturday, June 8. No one is allowed in the show area until judging is complete.
5. Show will be open to the public on Saturday, June 8, from noon until 4:00 pm. Exhibits **MAY NOT BE REMOVED** before 4:15 pm.
6. Any plant material on the New Jersey State Conservation List is not acceptable unless grown by the exhibitor and so stated on the entry.
7. A novice is one who enters competition for the first time or who has never won a blue ribbon in any previous Avalon Garden Club Flower Show.

## ARTISTIC RULES

1. Some real plant material required in all Classes unless otherwise stated. Cut flowers, dried flowers, foliage, fresh or dried fruit, and fresh or dried vegetables are considered real plant material. Flowers do not have to be homegrown but must be arranged by the exhibitor. Coloring of live plant material is prohibited.
2. No artificial flowers, foliage, fruit or vegetables are permitted.
3. Please call the consultant for information on and/or enrollment in the class
4. **Registration prior to the show is required**

## ARTISTIC RULES (cont'd.)

1. Enter as many classes as you wish, but only one entry per class is permitted.
2. All exhibits are **required** to be accompanied by an official card supplied by the committee. Complete your name, phone, and class entering. Be certain to complete **all** parts of the entry card. List all plant material used on an accompanying 3x5 card.
3. Entries eligible for judging must meet THEME and SIZE requirements of class as stated in Show Schedule. Any arrangement not fulfilling requirements will remain in place but **WILL NOT BE JUDGED**.

## HORTICULTURE RULES

1. Containers will be furnished for cut specimens. Cut specimens shall not have any foliage below the water line.
2. Entries **MUST** be grown by exhibitor. Houseplants must be in exhibitor's possession at least 3 months prior to the show unless otherwise stated.
3. All exhibits are **required** to be accompanied by an official entry card supplied by the committee. On the entry card, complete your name, phone number, section, and class of your specimen. Also, list the botanical Latin name, genus and species of your specimen.
4. Containers shall be clean, unbroken and free from salt buildup or stains. Size, shape, and color shall complement the plant.
5. Plants shall be groomed with no damaged or unclean foliage, wilted blooms, broken stems, or training props. There must be no evidence of pests or disease.
6. **Horticulture entries shall be brought in on Friday, June 7, 2019, 4pm to 6pm if possible.**

# ARTISTIC DESIGN DIVISION

Class 1 **Morning Mist**

A hanging arrangement viewed from all sides using some grey foliage. Space: Staged in a black wooden frame (32”H x 22”W) supplied by the committee; arrangement suspended from a hook; only means of suspension may touch the frame. Limited to four (4) entries.

Class 2 **My Silent Heart**

A miniature arrangement including red flowers not exceeding 5” in any direction. Space: Staged on a raised platform supplied by the Committee.

A small arrangement of dried flowers not exceeding 8” in any direction. Space: Staged on a raised platform supplied by the Committee.

A one sided arrangement in jewel tones. Accessories are permitted. Space: Staged in a shadow box (31” H, 27” W, 18” D) supplied by the Committee.

Artistic arrangement should be considered. Classes may be divided by the Committee if the number of entries permits. Plants for Classes 34 and 35 need only be in possession for six (6) weeks (by April 30,2019).
