INFORMATION AND RULES

1. Members of the Garden Club and the Public are invited and encouraged to participate as exhibitors. A special "Flower Show Program" will be held at the Avalon Garden Club's meeting Tuesday, May 17, 2022-10:30 AM at Avalon Community Hall. All exhibitors are encouraged to attend but not required.
2. An exhibitor is permitted only one entry per class, but may enter more than one class.
3. **Avalon Community Hall will be open for Registration of all Horticulture and Artistic Design exhibits on Friday, June 10,2022 - 3pm to 6pm. Artistic Design Exhibits Registration will additionally be held on Saturday, June 11,2022 - 8am-9am.**
4. All entries will be required to conform to additional rules listed in the Horticulture and Artistic Design rules.
5. All Exhibits will be judged by the attending public as "People's Choice" between the hours of 10am to 2pm on the day of the show. Each exhibit will be given a coin box at the time of registration. The attending public will be given one penny for each class in both Horticulture and Artistic Design. The public will vote by placing one penny in the coin holder of their favorite exhibit in each class. Each class in both divisions of Artistic Design and Horticulture will be awarded with one blue and one red ribbon. All winners of blue ribbons will also receive an award.

6. All exhibits must remain in place after registration until 4:15 pm following the closing of the show. ALL EXHIBITS AND RIBBONS MUST BE PICKED UP BY 4:15PM.
7. Any plant material on the New Jersey State Conservation List is not acceptable unless grown by the exhibitor and so stated on the entry.

ARTISTIC DESIGN DIVISION

ARTISTIC DESIGN DIVISION RULES

1. **Prior Registration to the show is required.** Prior registration involves calling the listed Consultant of the class or classes you wish to enter. Registration begins March 1,2022 with the deadline of Friday, June 3,2022 by 2pm. Consultants of each class will keep you informed of any updates and answer any questions you may have.
2. You must submit your exhibit at Registration on Friday, June 10,2022 - 3-6pm at Avalon Community Hall. You may also submit your exhibit and register on Saturday, June 11,2022 - 8-9 am. All entries are required to be accompanied by a 3x5 index card on one side listing your name, email address, phone number and class entering. The other side listing your Entry number.
3. Entries must meet the class requirements and passed by the Classification/Passing Chairperson and given an entry number.
4. No artificial flowers, foliage, fruit or vegetables are permitted unless otherwise noted.
5. Some real plant material is required in all classes unless otherwise noted. Fresh and dried flowers, foliage, fruits and vegetables are considered real plant material. Coloring of live plant material is prohibited.

The Beauty of Springtime on the Island

A Topiary Arrangement. *Space: Staged on a pedestal (40"H, 18" x 18" top) supplied by the Committee. The size should be appropriate for the 18" x 18" top of the pedestal. The container used should be a minimum pot size of 6".*

Sweets and Treats

A miniature cupcake arrangement in a soft pink, thick aluminum foil container (1.45"H x 2.56"W) supplied by the Committee. *Space: Staged on a raised platform also supplied by the Committee. Accessories permitted .*

Family Gatherings

A Birthday Cake made out of fresh flowers. Suggested size (6”H x 8”W), placed on a plate. Cakes are not to be over two tiers in height. You are permitted to use a cake pedestal. *Space: Staged on a table supplied by the Committee. Accessories permitted*

Class 4

The Window Boxes of Avalon

An arrangement in a window box (24”L x 9”D) in front of a window frame supplied by the Committee. Limited to four (4) entries.

A one-sided arrangement parallel design that is created in a rectangular container. The design reflects how a natural garden looks. HORTICULTURE DIVISION

HORTICULTURE DIVISION RULES

1. Prior Registration is not required. You must submit your entry at Registration on Friday, June 10, 2022, 3-6 pm. All entries are required to be accompanied by a 3x5 index card listing your name, email address, phone number and Section and Class you are entering on one side. The other side of the card must include the Common name of the plant and your entry number.
2. Entries must be passed by the Classification/Chairperson at Friday Registration before placed in the show area.
3. Entries must meet Container size requirements of the Section and Class. Containers must be clean, unbroken and free from salt buildup or stains. Size, shape and color shall complement the plant.
4. Plants shall be groomed with no damaged or unclean foliage, wilted blooms, broken stems, or training props. The plant must be free of any evidence of pests or disease.
5. Entries MUST be grown by exhibitor. Houseplants must be in exhibitor's possession at least 3 months prior to the show unless otherwise stated. Orchids must have been in the exhibitor's possession at least 90 day

This year's show will be judged by the attending public. Upon admission each visitor will receive a bag of pennies. All children attending will also receive their own bag of pennies. We will be having 6 Artistic and 7 Horticulture classes. So each visitor will receive 13 pennies.

Visitors then can vote for their favorite exhibit by placing one penny into the coin holder of their favorite exhibit of each class. Voting will take place from 10AM to 2PM. The votes will be counted and the winners announced at 3PM

The Educational Section of Artistic Design (Class 7) from Stone Harbor Elementary School will not be included in the voting by the Public.

AWARDS

The Flower Show Committee will count the coin boxes of each class after 2 PM and the award ceremony will be held at 3pm. All classes in Artistic Design and Horticulture will be awarded with one blue and one red ribbon for each class. All blue ribbon winners will also receive an award.
